She has a great attitude and is anxious to get home where her newly remodeled kitchen is waiting for her inspection. The remodel was started before she went into the hospital and is now finished. (All new appliances, new cabinets, granite counter tops and new paint) The anti-rejection medicine causes her immune system to be greatly

weakened and she will need to avoid exposure to any viruses or germs for about 3 months. We'll be staying at home and being very careful during that period. After that she will be able resume normal activities a little at a time. Our 1931 Tudor is named "Special Treat Also". Thanks for asking.

## **EDSEL'S BABY LINCOLN**



There's hardly a Model A owner anywhere that doesn't know Henry's nickname for his beloved Model T - "Tin Lizzie". But after a long bout with his business associates over keeping the T design in production, Henry finally wavered, and in May 1927, after having produced more than 15,000,000 Model Ts since 1908, Ford stopped all work on the assembly lines and began the process of retooling for his next success: the Model A.


This "New Ford" would be equally attributable to both Henry and his son, Edsel. While Henry continues to oversee the mechanical design, it will be Edsel Ford who brings the new look to the production line and with it, a new nickname - "Baby Lincoln". Not such a surprise when you consider the fact that the younger Ford always showed more interest than his father in flashier styling for automobiles. He indulged this proclivity in part with the purchase of the Lincoln Motor Company in 1922. With the new job at hand, Edsel, along with the help of designer Jozsef Galamb set out on the quest for a sleeker more stylish Ford body, but he didn't stop there. Edsel also prevailed upon his father to allow the

inclusion of four-wheel mechanical brakes and a sliding-gear transmission on this new model. The resulting design (The Model A) was a huge commercial success.

As president, Edsel Ford often disagreed with his father on major decisions and was occasionally humiliated by the older man for it. Despite this, Edsel managed to introduce many lasting changes to the Ford empire. He founded and named the Mercury division and was responsible for the Lincoln Zephyr and Lincoln Continental. He significantly strengthened Ford Motors' overseas production, and modernized the company's cars, such as introducing hydraulic brakes.

So just perhaps, our Temecula Valley Model A Club should consider spreading a little of the appreciation we often feel for our cars in the direction of Henry's son, Edsel Ford! I'm sure that in some small way our "Baby Lincolns" already do!


