An original, unrestored 1931 Special Delivery 255A. Believed to be one of only ten originals known to still exist in the world today. With less than 1000 ever being produced, they truly were rare and unique from the get go. The Special

Delivery was, at first glance, just a woody. But its many differences made this Model A uncommon indeed. Unlike the **Station Wagons** which were entirely open across the sides and back, the Special Delivery was closed. But this model featured something that no other Ford Woody had, nor would have until



1936! Roll up glass windows for both driver and passenger. Also featured was keyed locking (scrolled) handles on both front doors as well as the rear door making the vehicle completely secure. The seats were also different in that they were wider then the typical Model A fold down seat. Various other differences in and around the interior makes any (original) 255A a very sought after prize. This '31 Special Delivery will be featured in the next upcoming issue of the MAFCA Restorer magazine. Congratulations to Rudy & Lori on their latest addition to the corral.


# **ABOUT US**


