

Maple Dill Carrots



"Melted butter, maple syrup, and dill complement the carrots while bringing out their natural flavor." Prep Time: 10 min / Cook Time: 10 min / Servings: 4

INGREDIENTS:

3 cups peeled & sliced carrots 2 tablespoons butter

2 tablespoons maple syrup

1 1/2 tablespoons chopped fresh dill

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

DIRECTIONS:

Place carrots in a skillet and pour in just enough water to cover.

Bring to a boil over medium heat; simmer until water has evaporated and the carrots are tender. Stir in butter, maple syrup, dill, salt, and pepper.



WHY JUST ONE OUTSIDE DOOR LOCK?

All closed cab Model As [except for the 255A] came stock with a lock on the outside of the front right side door only. Drivers side door, as well as the rear doors on the Fordors, locked from the inside. Well, this was primarily because stepping out of your car and lingering to lock the door in the midst of traffic was a major safety issue. In fact, it was darn right dangerous due to the fact



that the roads back then lacked any type of painted lines to define just where the lanes were, and thus, cars were often all over the road (free for all) in every direction. Ford took this fact into serious consideration and designed the Model A with just the one external door lock in an effort to maximize the safety of these simple cars.
