* CARS & PASSENGERS SHOULD BE READY TO LEAVE AT THE DESIGNATED TIME (GASSED UP) *

st FOLLOW THE LEADER AND THE DESIGNATED ROUTE. MAINTAIN THE SPEED OF THE TOUR AS SET BY THE LEADER st

* KEEP THE CAR BEHIND YOU IN VIEW. ESPECIALLY AT CORNERS OR IN TOWN. DON'T LOSE THEM *

* THE TAIL CAR (TAIL ENDER) IS APPOINTED TO RUN LAST WITH A CB RADIO. DON'T TRY TO GET BEHIND HIM UNLESS YOU'RE IN A MODERN CAR *

st communicate with the leader or tail ender via CB radio or cell phone if necessary st

st keep enough distance between cars to allow other traffic to pass safely st

* NO CAR SHOULD LEAVE THE TOUR (PULL OVER AND STOP) WITHOUT FIRST NOTIFYING THE LEADER AND (OR) TAIL ENDER *

* YOU SHOULD NOT PASS ANOTHER MODEL A ON TOUR UNLESS THEY HAVE STOPPED BECAUSE OF TROUBLE *

* WHEN SOMEONE BREAKS DOWN, YOU SHOULD PULL OVER AND STOP ONLY IF IT IS SAFE TO DO SO AND YOU'RE EQUIPPED TO ACTUALLY HELP *

* INSTRUCT ANY GUESTS YOU MAY BRING ABOUT RESPECTING OTHER CARS, THEY ARE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY *

* ABIDE BY ALL TRAFFIC LAWS *

* ON TOURS, THE MODERN CARS SHALL ALWAYS FOLLOW THE MODEL A's *
