* CARS & PASSENGERS SHOULD BE READY TO LEAVE AT THE DESIGNATED TIME (GASSED UP) *

st Follow the leader and the designated route, maintain the speed of the tour as set by the leader st

* KEEP THE CAR BEHIND YOU IN VIEW, ESPECIALLY AT CORNERS OR IN TOWN. DON'T LOSE THEM *

* THE TAIL CAR (TAIL ENDER) IS APPOINTED TO RUN LAST WITH A CB RADIO. DON'T TRY TO GET BEHIND HIM UNLESS YOU'RE IN A MODERN CAR *

* COMMUNICATE WITH THE LEADER OR TAIL ENDER VIA CB RADIO OR CELL PHONE IF NECESSARY *

* KEEP ENOUGH DISTANCE BETWEEN CARS TO ALLOW OTHER TRAFFIC TO PASS SAFELY *

* NO CAR SHOULD LEAVE THE TOUR (PULL OVER AND STOP) WITHOUT FIRST NOTIFYING THE LEADER AND (OR) TAIL ENDER *

* YOU SHOULD NOT PASS ANOTHER MODEL A ON TOUR UNLESS THEY HAVE STOPPED BECAUSE OF TROUBLE *

* WHEN SOMEONE BREAKS DOWN, YOU SHOULD PULL OVER AND STOP <u>only</u> if it is safe to do so <u>and</u> you're equipped to actually help *
* Instruct any guests you may bring about respecting other cars, they are your responsibility *

* ABIDE BY ALL TRAFFIC LAWS *

* ON TOURS, THE MODERN CARS SHALL ALWAYS FOLLOW THE MODEL A's *
